Chairman and co-founder of the Institutue Rules for Growth / Droit et Croissance, a French Think Tank, Sophie Vermeille is a French qualified lawyer in restructuring and corporate law at DLA Piper in Paris and previously worked at Freshfields Bruckhaus Deringer, Weil, Gotshal & Manges and Clifford Chance. She is also a Lecturer at Sciences Po Paris, HEC Paris II and Paris II University (Panthéon Assas) and a Ph.D. candidate in the law and economics department of Paris II University, where she is about to finish a Ph.D. on economics of insolvency law. She holds a Master degree in Business Law from Paris II University and a Master degree from King's College London.

Sophie Vermeille has closely worked with the French government in order to promote an overhaul of French insolvency law.
